Public Participation:

Wayne Hershberger spoke about the status of purchasing the former school building. The loan requirements have changed and the process should be moving forward, will have another update at the next Council meeting in July.

The property owner will be sent a bill and failure to pay this bill within 90 days will result in a tax assessment.

Police-

Month of May 2026 Report

Patrol Operations/Calls for Service/Incidents

- 110 hours worked for the month of May
- Over 10 hours in training completed by PD personnel
- 3 traffic stops for speeding. Focus made on 3rd Street
- 1 traffic incident on 88 – motorist struck a deer
- All shifts completed business checks throughout the village

Administrative Activities

- Submitted all department background checks to the State of Ohio through LEADS
- Department personnel are currently compliant with background check requirements and investigation with LEADS is now closed
- Reviewing training records to identify and complete any remaining required training for personnel
- Continued efforts to establish electronic fax capabilities for department communications
- Process started for acquiring new and updated ID cards for officers

Personnel & Equipment

- 2 officer resignations for failure to complete required hours
- Collected department-issued badges, keys and resignation letters from officers
- Department has 2 police vehicles – 1 is in working condition and functions normally – the other will start but has issues accelerating/functioning
- Interested in either fixing the vehicle, stripping parts and selling or getting a grant to replace it

Overall Activity

- The village experienced a relatively quiet month with minimal enforcement activity and few calls for service
- Department efforts focused on routine patrol, administrative compliance, personnel management and community outreach

Water-

May Billing sent 5/15/2026. 2023 balance is paid in full. Relay issue at the county master meter caused water to be off on May 18th, county is also having issues with the Scada program delaying our tower from being online to handle these situations.

Sewer-

Pump station on 3rd was clogged with a t-shirt and King's had to pump there so that the pump could be accessed. Hooks are going to be added to all pump stations to help with these types of issues in the future. Dump station is moving along.

Zoning-

14 violations issued. 4 grass (2 grass and trash) and 10 vehicles

Roads-

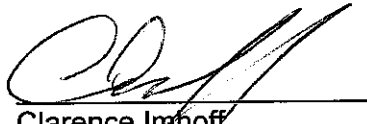
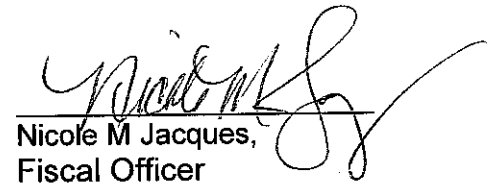
Working on obtaining 2027 monies for 1st Street and Grove. 2 tons of hot mix asphalt are needed at \$95.00 per ton
